



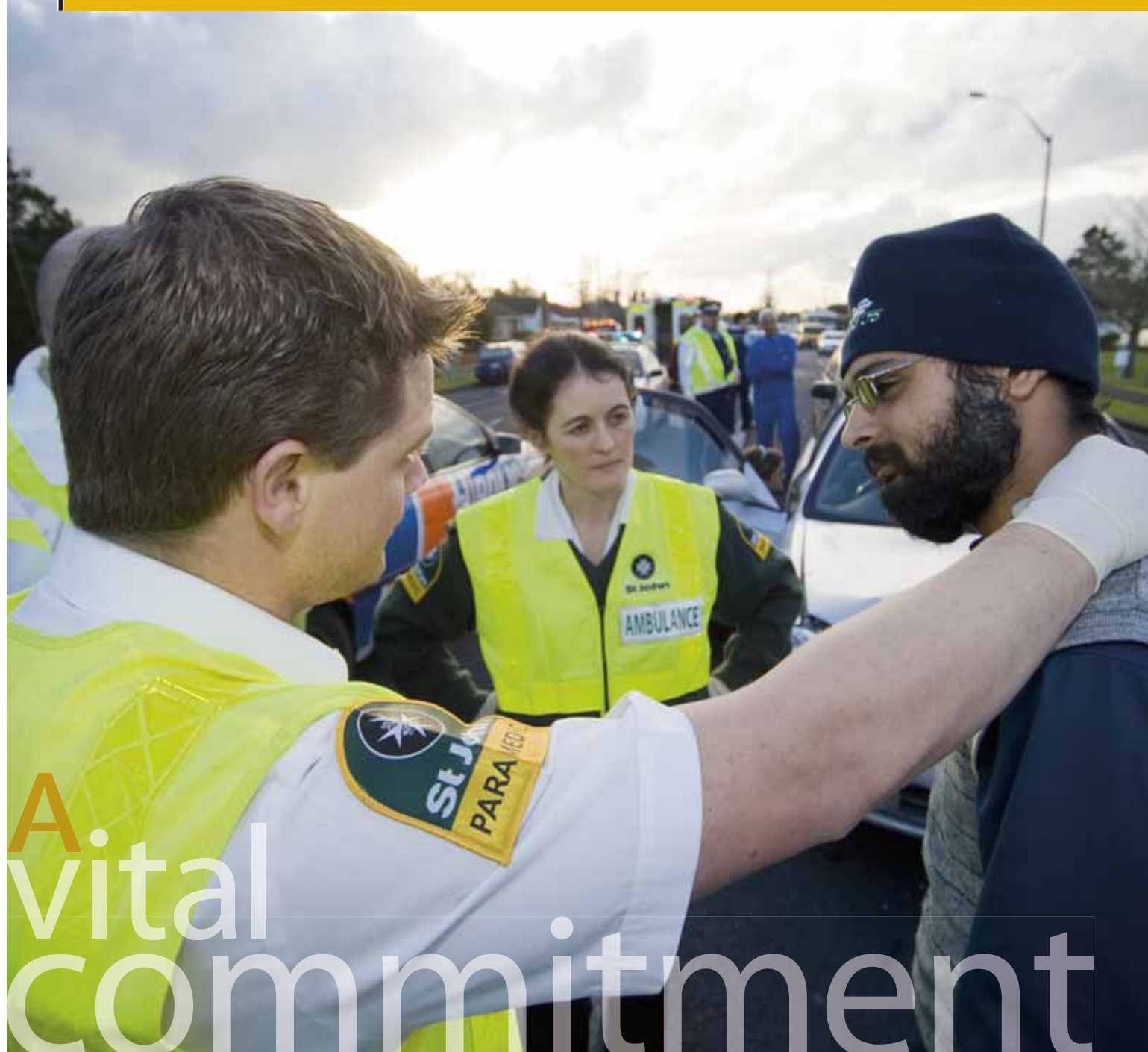

➤ New Zealanders see the St John symbol in many places – on the sides of ambulances, in hospitals where St John Friends of the Emergency Department volunteers offer caring patient assistance, or on football fields or netball courts where we provide first aid services.

A New Zealand Reader's Digest Survey this year again rated Ambulance Officers among the top two most trusted professions. It is to the credit of you, our members, that the community holds our people and our organisation in high esteem.

We are fortunate indeed to have a large team of committed people with high levels of clinical skill and professionalism across an increasingly strengthened national network.

But we couldn't do it without our fellow New Zealanders. We acknowledge the generosity of communities to support and sustain us. The most telling indicator has been the success of our philanthropic fundraising within the community in the past year, and the very generous support from individuals and organisations, a direct result of the fundraising work of our Area Committees and regional teams.

We continue to work in partnership with stakeholders, including our Crown funding partners, the Ministry of Health and Accident Compensation Corporation (ACC).

A new collaborative working agreement with the New Zealand Fire Service is a very welcome development, underpinning our commitment to enduring partnerships with national organisations that serve the community.

With several new and enhanced services, new partnerships and a huge step forward in national organisational design – the year in review has been very satisfying for St John.

Priorities

A key priority for St John has been our continuing work to unite our organisation as a focused, unified, national organisation. We have also strengthened our network of 142 Area Committees which are so vital to New Zealand communities.

The national Trust Board has introduced changes to achieve consistency of standards and delivery essential to a major national organisation, such as the ongoing rollout of our Project Twenty10 restructuring programme bringing a number of our operational responsibilities under a single national management structure. This is producing enhanced service delivery and performance accountability for our end users.

Much of this success is due to the support of our Regional Trust Boards. Undoubtedly, Project Twenty10 has been the most important change in this organisation's management structure for many years and its successful implementation is a major achievement.

Ambulance Communications Project

This year we have reached the final phase of the Ambulance Communications Project (ACP), our single biggest undertaking to date.

This Project has consolidated the nine Communications Centres which previously served New Zealand with different standards and protocols, into one virtual Communications Centre with standardised processes and technology. The three remaining Centres, in Auckland, Wellington and Christchurch, are all equipped with sophisticated new technology.

The technology is providing consistent, nationwide data for the first time; particularly important, given demand on Ambulance Services increases annually. The Project is in its final stages, with completion due by Christmas 2007.

St John led, St John managed and St John funded in partnership with the Ministry of Health, ACC, and Wellington Free Ambulance, this has been a huge achievement.

Clinical Training

We have completed a restructure of internal clinical training arrangements, and deployed more clinical support personnel in every region.

Our latest initiatives will ensure our Operations personnel are involved in continual education programmes, and that clinical competency is validated against correct benchmarks.

This all provides for a future with the appropriate training pathway and clinical support structure for our members.

Clinical excellence was a key theme of the outstanding St John Convention in Wellington in May 2007. The quality of the Convention and the enthusiastic participation of so many St John people was quite exceptional.

Ambulance Services

The matter of ambulance crewing levels has attracted media and political commentary during the year. It goes without saying we would welcome an increase in resources to increase our crewing levels in ambulances to international best practice standard.

At the beginning of the year, funding was again obtained for additional Ambulance resources, continuing the upward trajectory of the past three years – albeit at a lower level than we had made the case for.

We continue to advocate strongly for such support to continue and preferably accelerate, as we seek to provide Ambulance and other services to meet both rising expectations and increasing demands of a population that is both ageing and challenged by rising chronic illness levels.

External education

Our unique adult CPR training resource places New Zealand at the forefront of CPR training globally and, we believe, places St John First Aid Training courses as the best available in New Zealand.

We are currently training 55,000 people a year in CPR techniques, incorporating resources developed by Laerdal and the American Heart Association.

During the coming financial year, we will launch an infant version of the CPR manikin to train parents, expectant mothers and members of their families in infant CPR techniques, and how to deal with other emergencies.

Volunteering

The contribution of our volunteers is enormous and, in some activities, growing. This coming year, we plan to carry out a comprehensive quantification of the economic benefits of volunteers to our sector.

To preserve and promote our volunteers, we will continue to ensure we provide meaningful activity that adds value to the community and to volunteers' lives. We also acknowledge the huge commitment of our volunteers' families.

Community programmes

Our Community Care and Youth programmes continue to develop, providing an increasingly valuable service to communities across New Zealand.

Activities such as our Caring Caller, Friends of the Emergency Department, Health Shuttle, Outreach Therapy Pets, and St John Youth programmes present the strongest possible evidence against the argument that volunteering has had its day in New Zealand.

Governance

This year a new independent appointee, John Harman, joined the Trust Board. John is a former Board member – and it's great to have him back. We also welcomed Dr Richard Worth to the Board, following his appointment as the Chairman of Northern Regional Trust Board.

Two independent trustees, Sue Wood and Ed Sullivan, have been reappointed for further terms as members of the Board.

The Priory of New Zealand

We welcomed the appointment of our new Prior, His Excellency The Honourable Anand Satyanand, in June 2006. Their Excellencies The Honourable Anand and Mrs Susan Satyanand have generously engaged with St John.

Our ultimate governance body, Chapter chaired by the Prior, has met on three occasions this year, including an event to welcome our new Prior at Government House in Auckland. Members of Chapter have again brought service and wisdom to the affairs of the Order of St John in New Zealand.

New Zealand's financial support of the famous St John Eye Hospital in Jerusalem has again been exceptional, reflecting the Priory in New Zealand's membership of the worldwide Venerable Order of the Hospital of St John of Jerusalem.

We thank every St John member for your contribution to this great organisation. You are an awesome team – and we thank each and every one of you for making St John what we are today – and encourage you to continue your exceptional efforts.

Our Hospital marked its 125th anniversary in May 2007, with 28 New Zealanders accepting an invitation to join the celebrations and making the once-in-a-lifetime journey.

The group toured the St John of Jerusalem Eye Hospital and clinics to see first-hand how our New Zealand support helps make medical treatment available to four million people in the Holy Land.

To see the smiling faces of the patients, both young and old, who have had sight restored was heartwarming. Our group attended a function for staff and visitors from around the world, a Service of Thanksgiving, and the Investiture of 50 Hospital staff into the Order of St John. The staff are all humble about what they do to care for so many in what can be very trying circumstances.

A special Icon was created by sculptor Fawzy Nastas to mark the Hospital's Anniversary and the launch of a Patient Relief Appeal. Fawzy is the only sculptor in the West Bank, Gaza Strip and East Jerusalem, and his family has a long association with St John.

Carved out of Jerusalem stone, the Icon depicts a pair of hands holding up a stylised representation of the Hospital. It is a symbol of the Hospital's charitable works and a call to supporters for aid. It was brought back to New Zealand from the Grand Council in South Africa by our Chancellor Rob Fenwick and displayed at our Convention 2007. Our group took the Icon back to Jerusalem.

Growing numbers of patients are being treated by the Hospital, as medical staff increase their efforts to take vital services into the community. Patients pass through road blocks and security to access initial treatment but the difficulty of travelling means patients often don't return for follow-up care. Clinics and the Mobile Outreach Team ensure people receive the follow-up that improves their medical outcomes and quality of life.

The Hospital has a long-standing clinic at Gaza and opened a second at Hebron in late 2005. In April, the Hospital opened a new Eye Centre at Anabta in the north of the West Bank. Anabta, 90km from Jerusalem, was selected because of its central location. Medical teams can now reach almost all of the West Bank towns, villages and refugee camps.

In the past year, members have contributed to and helped to raise \$150,000 to support the St John of Jerusalem Eye Hospital. Successful fundraising events included \$8,000 raised by the Hamilton Hospitaller's Club through a range of creative activities, a record \$4,300 collected at our Investiture Service in May 2007, and many fundraising efforts by Hospitaller's Clubs and others all over New Zealand.

The Hospital is enjoying greater international exposure with visits from British and Japanese government ministers and international agencies, such as UNICEF.

We acknowledge the huge contribution, dedication and kindness of our regions, Hospital coordinators and members throughout the country. Thank you to everyone who supports our Hospital – a cornerstone of St John.

To mark the 125th anniversary of the St John of Jerusalem Eye Hospital a special Icon was created, carved from Jerusalem stone.

Heroic deeds will be recorded and long-lost photographs revealed in a comprehensive new history of St John in New Zealand, being produced to mark our 125th anniversary in 2010.

Leading historian and biographer Graeme Hunt is writing the first totally new history of our organisation since the most recent official national history was published in 1977. This will be a history New Zealanders can read to learn what St John has done for and with their community.

Exciting new finds Graeme has discovered in his research to date include photographs we didn't know existed, quotes in colonial archives, and new information about the founding of our organisation.

All over New Zealand, historic and important St John photographs are sitting on walls or in cabinets silvering and deteriorating, and minute books containing valuable information are decaying in boxes in garden sheds. This project will help to pull all this information together and ensure it is preserved for current and future generations to enjoy.

This is a very different approach to St John's history than ever before. There will be a lot of new material, some surprises and the book will certainly dispel some myths. The last history was written in 1977 and updated for our Centenary in 1985.

Everything that Graeme uncovers through his research is also being scanned and kept on record. There is a lovely irony in the fact that we are using modern computers, scanning technology and restoration techniques to preserve all our treasured documents and history.

The book is also part of a concerted effort to develop a Heritage Policy for St John, and to collate and preserve our heritage in New Zealand using the latest technology.

The role of Librarian was revived in 2005. I also work with Order Matters Director Peter Wood (Wellington), Priory Dean Simon Rae (Dunedin) and Russell Martin (Auckland) on our Historical Advisory Committee.

We also have Archives in Auckland and Christchurch, and material in the Hocken Library in Dunedin, the Alexander Turnbull in Wellington and the Taranaki Regional Museum.

Two special projects are also underway to complement this work. We are updating the Roll of the Order of St John from 1895 to the present day. The Roll lists all Members of the Order and their membership details. The list of St John Office Holders will also be updated for the first time since 1985 and checked for any inaccuracies.

We are an iconic organisation and have a responsibility to preserve our history. We want to make sure that we know where all our historical treasures are, that they are safe, and that we are protecting the heritage of our organisation's great contribution to the communities of New Zealand.

Our work could not be possible without the support of the two archives teams in Northern Region and Northern Region (SI) and the members who are passionate about preserving our heritage.

A number of important decisions and actions have been taken during the year to support St John's strategy objective of ensuring the integrity of the Order of St John is protected and maintained.

Most important are the adoption of Grand Council Instructions designed to protect and reinforce the position of the Order of St John as a recognised Order of Chivalry. The Order was established by and is dependent on the Crown of the United Kingdom and recognised by the New Zealand Royal Honours System.

The first Instruction defines the relationship between the Order of St John and other Orders of Chivalry and organisations that purport to be Orders of Chivalry. In essence, the Order of St John will only recognise Orders of Chivalry that fit within a very tight definition.

The second Instruction makes it clear that the only insignia which may be worn by members of St John in uniform, at St John events or with our Order's insignia, are those which are contained in the Order of Wear approved by The Queen of New Zealand. The Order of Wear also shows the sequence in which orders, decorations and medals should be worn.

These Instructions have been noted by Priory Chapter and are being implemented. The international review of Order Honours which is discussed in the Registrar's Report is being fully supported.

The project to update the honours and awards section in members' records has been a mammoth task, capturing service information, State honours and awards, and post nominal letters. It is pleasing to see a large number of retrospective service awards granted. As well as the service awards documented in this report, nearly 1,000 service badges, recognising three, six or nine years of service to St John, have been distributed to Regions for presentation.

The Order of St John is unique, requiring Members to make a declaration that they will actively engage in our Order's charitable work. As you will see from this Yearbook and companion Annual Report, Members contribute in many different ways.

I am very proud of everyone who supports the Order of St John and thank you all for your contribution.

The year in review has seen some significant developments for our Honours system.

The recommendations of the Committee undertaking the international review of Order Honours, which I signaled in my last report, have now been adopted by the Grand Council – our Order's international governing body.

Our Priory Chapter has adopted all the recommendations on a working basis from 1 January 2007 – the first Establishment to do so. The changes will take full effect when the Order's Statutes and Regulations are next amended.

The most significant changes are that the nomenclature for Grade V (Serving Brother and Serving Sister) is changed to Member, and that Grade VI (Esquires) will eventually be abolished. Existing Esquires will retain membership rights. A new role of Priory Esquire is being implemented to support ceremonial activities.

The criteria for admission and promotion in the Order is also amended so that it is conferred in recognition of achievement, the successful discharge of responsibility, or notable and selfless service in furthering the objects and purposes of the Order. The overriding principle is that a person is admitted to, or promoted in, the Order because of his or her merit.

You will see some of the changes reflected in the Roll of the Priory printed in this Yearbook. As well as the name change for Grade V, the Rolls of Knights and Dames of Justice and of Grace have been merged. Knights and Dames of Justice are indicated by (J) following their entry in the Roll. This action was recommended by the review committee, which wished to dispel the widely held belief that Knights and Dames of Justice (classified as such because they have a Grant of a Coat of Arms) constituted a separate Grade.

The roll of the Priory currently stands at 1,574, made up of St John members throughout the country, honoured for their huge contributions to our communities. I wish to convey my thanks to all who support the Order's administration in New Zealand, and to congratulate everyone who received awards and honours this year.

➤ **May I begin my first Report with an appreciation for the work of the Very Rev Dr Warren Limbrick, whose period as Priory Dean saw important changes in St John Chaplaincy implemented.**

Under his guidance we have moved from a largely formal and ceremonial role to at least the first stages of an effective functional Chaplaincy, offering support for our own members and those who support their engagement with St John. We are grateful for Warren's role in New Zealand and internationally, and his willingness to continue as a Regional Chaplain.

A new Priory initiative has been the appointment of a Principal Chaplain, with the specific task of facilitating the selection, appointment and support of Regional and District Chaplains. The Rev Bob Tremewan is a valued colleague who brings extensive experience in St John, education and ministry to this key task.

My engagement with St John in recent years has been at Area level, alongside a role as Joint Regional Chaplain in Southern Region. A priority now is to become quickly familiar with the regional and national structures of St John and with those who serve within them. Feedback from Areas and Regions will be helpful and appreciated.

A Conference of South Island St John Chaplains in January, initiated and facilitated by the Principal Chaplain and hosted in Christchurch by Northern Region (SI), was a significant opportunity for networking, orientation and practical planning. Veteran and new Chaplains enjoyed meeting each other and interacting with St John members. Briefings were provided by key regional personnel involved in management and the implementation of Project Twenty10.

I enjoyed sharing in the 29 April 2007 celebration of the foundation of St John in New Zealand in Christchurch in St Mary's Church, Merivale. The Church's then Vicar, the Rev Thomas Flavell, called the meeting on 30 April 1885 which led to the establishment of St John in New Zealand. This is surely one of the special places associated with our history – and a congregation that continues practical support for our work today.

My initial observation is that St John operates between two poles in regard to religion. One is that the Order of St John is a Christian Order of chivalry and service. The other is that the Order's service arms have never had any more than a very general religious identity, expressed in terms of ethos and values, rather than in set patterns of belief and worship.

In the stresses of structural change and the increased demands we all experience, there is great value in recalling and reinforcing the ideals that undergird St John. These include compassion, loyalty, respect, team orientation, initiative, perseverance, courage and openness to one another. These are all part of our Christian heritage.

In our Youth Programme, study for the Faith Badge provides a context in which the positive, sensitive reinforcing of the dimensions of faith and a sense of service and vocation can play a valuable role for young people. This will set them in good stead as they explore personal issues of identity, worth, self-image and their place in the community.

The Chaplaincy team that is emerging in St John has exciting elements of cooperation between Catholic and Protestant, lay and ordained, women and men. All offer skills, insights and experience within a flexible but agreed framework. Some are very new to St John, but a significant number began as Youth members. It is a healthy model of partnership that values both diversity and team spirit.

➤ **The Service Medal of the Order of St John is unique as it is the only medal still issued that retains the image of Queen Victoria and the only one which has her facing to the right. It was first awarded in New Zealand in 1908. Queen Victoria established the Order as a Royal Order of Chivalry with the Royal Charter of 1888.**

The Service Medal is awarded for efficient service after 12 years, with a Bar to the Medal available for every subsequent five years' service. The Gilt Laurel Leaf (instituted in 2004) is awarded after 52 years of service.

The Service Medal is accorded a place in the New Zealand Order of Wear: Orders, Decorations and Medals, approved by The Queen.
